Distinctive Areas and Landscapes Standing Advisory Committee: Bass Coast Statement of Planning Policy

We are writing to you because you made a submission to Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) on behalf of the Minister for Planning (the Proponent) to the draft Bass Coast Statement of Planning Policy (Bass Coast SPP).

The Minister for Planning has determined to refer the draft Bass Coast SPP and all written submissions (747 submissions) to the Distinctive Areas and Landscapes (DAL) Standing Advisory Committee (the Committee) for its consideration. The letter of referral is attached for your convenience.

Background

The Minister for Planning appointed the Committee pursuant to section 151 of the *Planning and Environment Act 1987* to provide advice on referred projects and associated draft Planning Scheme Amendments.

The Committee

Committee members Kathy Mitchell AM (Chair), Peter Edwards and Jess Tulloch will be present at the Directions Hearing. For noting, Ms Mitchell was the Chair, and Mr Edwards was a member of the Committee that considered the Surf Coast DAL in 2021. The final allocation of members will be provided before the Hearing commences.

This letter:

- informs you about the Committee's consultation and hearing process
- informs you what do if wish to participate in the Committee process
- explains how the Committee will use information provided throughout this process
- sets out some key dates for the exchange of information before the hearing.

The Hearing process

The Committee will:

- hear submitters in an independent forum by video conference, or in person if permitted
- be informal and not like a court
- give fair, unbiased advice to the Minister for Planning.

The Committee process includes a Directions Hearing and the Hearing.

Directions Hearing

The Committee will convene a Directions Hearing to be held by video conference using MS Teams at **10.00am**, **Tuesday**, **13 December 2022**.

At the Directions Hearing, the Committee will:

- give directions about exchanging information before the Hearing and the conduct of the Hearing
- consider Hearing times and venue and site inspections
- answer questions people have about the Committee process including the Hearing.

You should attend the Directions Hearing if you:

- are new to the hearing process or wish to participate in the Hearing
- have questions about the Committee process or wish to raise procedural issues.

The Committee proposes to issue directions after considering all requests to be heard and any additional matters raised at the Directions Hearing.

Expert witness statements and submissions

The Committee intends to direct that the Minister for Planning's initial submission and any expert witness statement(s) be provided to other parties at least five business days before the Hearing.

Hearing

The purpose of the public Hearing is for people to speak to their written submission. The Hearing is proposed to start from **6 March 2023** and should run for approximately four to six weeks. The Hearing is open for anyone to attend.

The Hearing may be held by video conference or in person or a combination of both, including a hybrid approach. If the Hearing is in person, parts of it may be held locally in Bass Coast Shire, or Melbourne, or a mix of both depending on circumstances. The final form of the Hearing and its location will be considered by the Committee at the Directions Hearing.

The Committee will consider all the referred written submissions when preparing its report, including those from submitters who do not attend the Hearing.

Completing the Request to be Heard Form

When completing the online request to be heard form, please note the following details.

When will the Hearing be held?

The expected hearing dates are between 6 March 2023 and 14 April 2023.

What if I have availability issues during the expected hearing dates?

You can tell us when you are not available.

The Committee will accommodate your availability where possible.

Time required to present your submission

You will be allocated 10 minutes for your submission if this field is left blank.

Expert witness details

An expert witness gives evidence in a field of expertise and must prepare a report.

If you propose to call expert witnesses, you must:

- provide details of all expert witnesses on the request to be heard form this includes their name, organisation, and field of expertise
- circulate expert witness reports at a specified time before the Hearing.

Participants in the Hearing can cross-examine expert witnesses.

What happens after I complete the form?

If you complete this form, a letter with directions and a timetable for the Hearing will be emailed to you after the Directions Hearing. Your name and email address will also be added to the Distribution List for the circulation of information like reports and submissions for the Hearing unless you tell us otherwise.

What if I do not have an email address?

How will my contact information be used?

We will use your contact address to contact you. We will provide your email or postal address to participants in the Hearing so that they can share reports and submissions unless you tell us otherwise.

Access requirements

Please contact Planning Panels Victoria (PPV) with any access requirements. Some Hearings are at PPV, some are at other locations, and some are held online. PPV Hearing Rooms are accessible for mobility impaired persons and are equipped with a hearing loop, and a laptop and projector if required. Please note that even when your personal information is removed from the internet, it may remain on external servers indefinitely.

Hearing of submissions

A Hearing may be held in person at a venue, by telephone conference, by video link, or a combination of these. You should be aware the Committee may:

- broadcast submissions and proceedings live on the internet
- record submissions and proceedings

BASS COAST STATEMENT OF PLANNING POLICY: REFERRAL OF MATTERS TO THE DISTINCTIVE AREAS AND LANDSCAPES STANDING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

I am writing to refer the draft Bass Coast Statement of Planning Policy (draft SPP) and proposed landscape planning controls for the Bass Coast declared area to the committee for advice, in accordance with your terms of reference (version 3: amended April 2022).

Along with the draft SPP and proposed landscape planning controls, I am referring all written public submissions made during the public consultation period of 3 March to 29 April 2022, for consideration.

I direct the committee to provide advice on, and recommendations in relation to:

- whether the draft SPP:
 - appropriately supports the objects of Part 3AAB Distinctive Areas and Landscapes of the Planning and Environment Act 1987 (P&E Act) as set out in section 46AN of the that Act;
 - creates an appropriate framework for the future use and development of land in the Bass Coast declared area to ensure the protection and conservation of the distinctive attributes of that declared area, for the purposes of section 46AU of the P&E Act;
 - iii. complies with the required contents of an SPP as specified in section 46AV of the P&E Act; and
 - iv. is otherwise robust and appropriate.
- whether the proposed landscape controls support the objects of Part 3AAB of the P&E Act and would, if translated into a planning scheme amendment, assist giving effect to the draft SPP; and
- c. any amendments that should be made to the structure or content of the draft SPP or the proposed landscape planning controls in light of your advice on points (a)-(b) above.

I have written to Cr Michael Whelan, Mayor of Bass Coast Shire to inform Council of this referral.
