## Declarations

The Panel made no declarations.

## Procedural matters

### Deferral of the Hearing

Melbourne Water, represented by Louise Hicks of Counsel, requested that the hearing be deferred to July or September to allow for the drainage strategy to be completed and properly considered. Ms Hicks submitted that proceeding with the hearing as scheduled is premature as the drainage strategy will form the strategic basis for planning provisions being considered within the Macaulay Structure Plan area.

The Department of Transport and Planning (DTP), represented by Alison McFarlane, advised that officers were not authorised by the Minister to consent to different dates or deferral of the hearing. DTP considered that the Advisory Committee can consider whether there are limitations in providing advice to the Minister however that the Advisory Committee would need to apply to the Minister to seek a variation to the Terms of Reference to facilitate a deferral.

Melbourne City Council did not consider that there was sufficient basis for a deferral.

Other parties were neutral or did not comment.

The Advisory Committee directed that they would proceed with the hearing dates as scheduled. The Committee noted that it can consider submissions in relation to whether the planning provisions are premature in relation to drainage, noting however that the Committee has not been asked to provide advice on the funding and delivery of flood mitigation infrastructure or whether Melbourne Water should be a determining referral authority.

#### **Party who did not make a submission requesting to be heard**

The Kensington Association did not make a submission to Amendment C417melb and did not attend the Directions Hearing however had previously written to Planning Panels Victoria (PPV) requesting that they be able to present to the Advisory Committee given the change in proposed planning provisions for Macaulay (with the translation to the Precinct Zone and Built Form Overlays). Council had advised the Advisory Committee that they were content for parties who did not make a submission to be heard given the change in process and controls initiated by the Minister for Planning.

The DTP considered that the Advisory Committee would need to make a request to the Minister to vary the Terms of Reference to facilitate this request. Council disagreed, stating that the Terms of Reference were not limited to consideration of submissions during the exhibition period but rather a broader consideration of the suitability of planning provisions to guide future land use and development in Macaulay.

The Terms of Reference state that the Committee can inform itself in any way it sees fit. The Committee can consider a submission from the Kensington Association if a submission is provided to Council in the first instance and then referred to the Committee. The Committee does note however that the Minister has not requested advice on whether the Precinct Zone and Built Form Overlays are the appropriate Victoria Planning Provision tools to guide built form and land use outcomes in Macaulay and that any submission made must raise issues relating to a Referred Matter. PPV will reach out to Kensington Association to inform them of this process.

#### **Hearing venue**

Planning Panels Victoria will continue to work with Melbourne City Council and the Department of Transport and Planning to secure a suitable venue for the hearing and will advise parties once this is finalised.

## Circulating documents

1. Council must host and manage online document sharing. The document sharing platform must allow a party to view and circulate documents, and allow parties to upload and download documents directly.
2. Documents must be circulated electronically by uploading them to the document sharing platform. When uploading documents, a party must email all other parties on the distribution list to inform them of the document(s) that have been uploaded.
3. Documents must be available to access and download from the document sharing platform until the date the report is submitted by the Advisory Committee. Each party is responsible to retain any documents before that date.
4. Documents must meet the following requirements:
  - a) Files must not exceed 20MB in size.
  - b) File names must be as short as possible and begin with the name of the party as it appears on the distribution list:  
[Party name] - [Document Title].
  - c) If tabling more than 10 documents at once, all documents must be provided through a fileshare link (for example, DropBox or OneDrive) and be accompanied by an index list.
  - d) A Microsoft Word version or unlocked pdf version of the document must be emailed directly to [office@planningpanels.vic.gov.au](mailto:office@planningpanels.vic.gov.au) after being circulated.
5. All information presented to the Panel for the purposes of the Panel process is a public document solely for that purpose unless the Panel directs otherwise. It cannot be used for any other purpose.

### Notes

Any request to access a document after that date will be subject to the Freedom of Information process.

If your document is larger than 20MB, break it down into parts that are less than 20MB each.

If you do not circulate documents by the specified time, the Advisory Committee may not accept the evidence or material. If you think you will not meet the specified deadline you must provide reasons in writing to [office@planningpanels.vic.gov.au](mailto:office@planningpanels.vic.gov.au) before the deadline.

The Advisory Committee will not publish or accept material that contains offensive or defamatory material, or personal information about other people (such as emails and phone numbers or photographs of people, particularly children).

Paper documents will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances.

## Before the Hearing

### Confirmation of experts

6. All parties who have not already provided names and areas of expertise of witnesses, must do so before **12 noon on Friday 20, February 2026**.

### Notice of the Hearing

7. Council must publish notice of the Hearing on its website, with information on how members of the public can observe it in person/online.

### Information to be provided

8. Council must provide a map showing the location of submitters (including any late accepted submitters) to the Panel by **12 noon on Friday 27, February 2026**. The Plan must:

- a) identify submitters by submitter number, and not by name
  - b) be provided only to the Advisory Committee.
9. Council must circulate the following documents by **12 noon Friday 20, February 2026**.
- a) A full set of post exhibition documents (excluding the SUZ and DDO's), including post exhibition changes
  - b) A copy of the Precinct Zone Schedule 1 and Built Form Overlay schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4
  - c) A copy of the proposed Planning Scheme maps for the zones and overlays, including Precinct Zone, Built Form Overlay Schedules 1-4, Parking Overlay and DCPO
  - d) Any changes to the Incorporated or Background documents or proposed changes in list/table form, including:
    - (i) Macaulay Final Structure Plan, June 2022 – Background Document
    - (ii) Macaulay Off Street Car Parking Plan, June 2022 – Background Document
    - (iii) Macaulay Stubbs and Boundary Precincts New and Widened Streets and Laneways and Cross Sections – Incorporated Document
    - (iv) Macaulay Urban Renewal Precinct Development Contributions Plan, July 2024 – Incorporated Document
  - e) Council Meeting Agenda and Minutes dated 2 December 2025
  - f) Other background technical reports that form the strategic basis of the Amendment.

**Note**

If you need additional information from another party and they have not agreed to provide it to you, you should make a request in writing to the Panel requesting it to direct the provision of the information. The information must be related to the proposal and be of assistance to the Advisory Committee. Requests should be short and clearly state why you need the information.

### Council Part A (background and context) submission

10. Council must circulate a Part A (Background and context) submission by **12 noon on Thursday, 19 March 2026** that includes:
- a) a summary of the physical context of the subject area and surrounds
  - b) background to the Amendment including chronology of events
  - c) a summary of the conditions of authorisation and how they have been met
  - d) a summary of the strategic context, including:
    - (i) relevant planning policies and provisions
    - (ii) any other recently approved or upcoming amendments that might impact on the Amendment
  - e) any differences between the strategic planning documents and the provisions of the amendment and reasons for any differences
  - f) a summary of the issues raised in submissions, including an explanation of which (if any) of those issues have been resolved and how
  - g) a summary of the response to referred matters.

**Note**

Council's Part A (background and context) submission will be taken as read. Council should allow time for questions on Day 1 of the Hearing.

### Expert details and statements

11. Any expert witness statements must be circulated as follows:
- a) Council must circulate its expert statement(s) by **12 noon on Tuesday 17, March 2026**

- b) other parties must circulate their expert statement(s) by **12 noon on Friday 27, March 2026**.

12. An expert statement must:

- a) comply with the PPV Practice Note 1 - Expert Evidence ([Expert witnesses \(planningpanels.vic.gov.au\)](http://planningpanels.vic.gov.au))
- b) not refer to any individual submitter by name – if necessary, individual submitters should be referred to by submission number. Community groups, organisations, corporations and government agencies can be referred to by name.

13. An expert can provide a response to other like evidence by 12 noon the business day before the Hearing commences.

### Site inspection

14. A Party seeking to provide the Panel with locations to view during its unaccompanied site inspections, must provide the following by **12 noon Friday 27, March 2026**:

- a) A description or map of locations to be viewed
- b) Brief explanatory notes of the site features or context for the Committee to observe

### At the Hearing

15. Council must provide administrative support to manage the Hearing.

#### Note

This may include finding a suitable venue for an in person Hearing, or if the Hearing is online or hybrid, configuring a video conference meeting, publishing links to the Hearing online, issuing direct invitations to participants (including the Advisory Committee, parties and experts) and providing technical support. It may also include managing the document sharing platform and making audio recordings of sessions if directed by the Advisory Committee.

### Presenting material

16. Submissions, presentations and other material presented to the Advisory Committee:

- a) must be presented electronically
- b) must be circulated by 12 noon on the business day before the material is to be presented
- c) should relate to the matters before the Advisory Committee
- d) must include a summary of fewer than 5 pages if the material is more than 40 pages.

### Council Part B (main) submission

17. Council must provide a Part B (main) submission by **12 noon on Thursday, 2 April 2026**. The Part B submission must address the following issues:

- a) the strategic basis for the amendment under each of the referred matters
- b) difference between the strategic planning documents and the amendment and reasons for any differences
- c) a schedule of planning permits identifying any conflicts with proposed building heights, setbacks and building separation; overshadowing, street wall heights, floor area ratios and wind provisions.
- d) a schedule of current planning permit applications and approved planning permits identifying any potential conflicts with intersections and road designs in the DCP.
- e) its response to submissions and evidence
- f) its final position on the Referred Matters.

18. Council must circulate a 'Day 1' version of the Amendment documentation by **12 noon on Thursday, 2 April 2026**. The Day 1 version must:
- a) show any suggested changes in response to submissions
  - b) be marked up against the exhibited version
  - c) be labelled 'Council Day 1 version – Clause X'
  - d) be in an editable format such as MS Word.

### Other party submissions

19. A party who objects to the proposal must say how the proposal impacts them, how the proposal is inconsistent with Council or government policy or strategy, or both.
20. A party who intends to supplement their original written submission but not present at the Hearing must circulate their supplementary written submission by Thursday 2 April 2026.

**Note**

For information on how to prepare and present material at a Hearing, refer to the [PPV Website](#).

### Evidence and cross examination

21. Unless agreed by the Chair, evidence-in-chief should be no longer than 30 minutes.
22. An expert may present a summary of their evidence at the Hearing, but it must:
- a) not include new evidence
  - b) be circulated by 12 noon the business day before that expert is scheduled to appear.
23. If giving evidence online, an expert must:
- a) be alone in the room from which they give evidence and not make or receive any communication with another person while giving evidence except with permission from the Advisory Committee
  - b) inform the Advisory Committee immediately should another person enter the room from which they are giving evidence
  - c) not discuss their evidence with any other person during breaks in evidence when under cross examination
  - d) not have before them any document, other than their expert statement and relevant joint experts report and supporting documents.
24. A party, advocate and the Advisory Committee may question an expert.
25. A party who intends to question an expert must provide written notice to Planning Panels Victoria ([planning.panels@transport.vic.gov.au](mailto:planning.panels@transport.vic.gov.au)) by 3pm the day before the expert is due to appear.
26. If cross examining an expert, a party must:
- a) be present for the whole of the expert giving their evidence
  - b) ask clear and relevant questions, directed to matters of fact or professional opinion, that genuinely assist the Advisory Committee in understanding the issues
  - c) allow the expert time to explain their answer.

**Notes**

The Chair will regulate cross examination. During the Hearing, the Chair may ask you how much time you will need for cross examining each expert, and will ask you to keep to your estimate. You should aim to complete your cross examination as concisely as possible.

Cross examination time may be limited.

You may be asked to move on to another topic if the line of questioning is not useful to the Committee.

Things to avoid when cross examining include:

- making a submission or providing your opinion
- giving extensive comment or context as an introduction to your question
- asking questions that are unrelated to the evidence
- arguing with the expert
- commenting on the expert or the evidence
- asking questions that have already been asked by another party.

If you do not support the evidence or basis on which it was prepared, or consider the evidence should not be given weight, detail your reasons in your submission rather than raising these issues in cross examination.

If you are not experienced in cross examination, you are encouraged to write your questions down to ensure they are succinct, structured into themes and able to be asked without long explanations of the context.

## Part C (closing) submissions

27. Council will be provided time to present a Part C (closing) submission. The Part C (closing) submissions:
- a) must not raise new matters
  - b) may respond to matters raised in other parties' submissions or evidence.

## Drafting changes

28. Council must circulate its final preferred version of the Amendment documentation with its Part C (closing) submission. The final preferred version must:
- a) show changes proposed in response to evidence or submissions presented at the Hearing
  - b) be marked up against the Council Day 1 version (refer to Direction 18)
  - c) be labelled 'Council Part B (closing) version – Clause X'
29. A party seeking to provide drafting comments on the Council Part C (closing) version of the Amendment documentation must circulate them by Thursday 7 May 2026. Drafting comments must only relate to drafting issues, not broader issues.

### Note

Comments on the final version of Amendment documentation must be limited to drafting (form and content).

Drafting comments can be provided even though your primary position may be that the proposal should not be supported.

## Privacy and use of personal information

30. A party must not record, keep, distribute or publish contact details of any other party obtained during the Advisory Committee process, or use those contact details for any other purpose.
31. A party must not record any part of a Hearing by any means without permission from the Chair.
32. A party who wishes proceedings to be recorded must make a request to the Chair at least five business days before the Hearing commences, outlining its reasons.
33. If Planning Panels Victoria records a Hearing, any person provided with a copy of the recording must not publish or distribute that recording or use it for any purpose other than for the Advisory Committee process.

### Note

Advisory Committee hearings are only recorded in exceptional circumstances. EES Hearings are generally recorded (audio only), but you should check with Planning Panels Victoria before the Hearing starts.
